

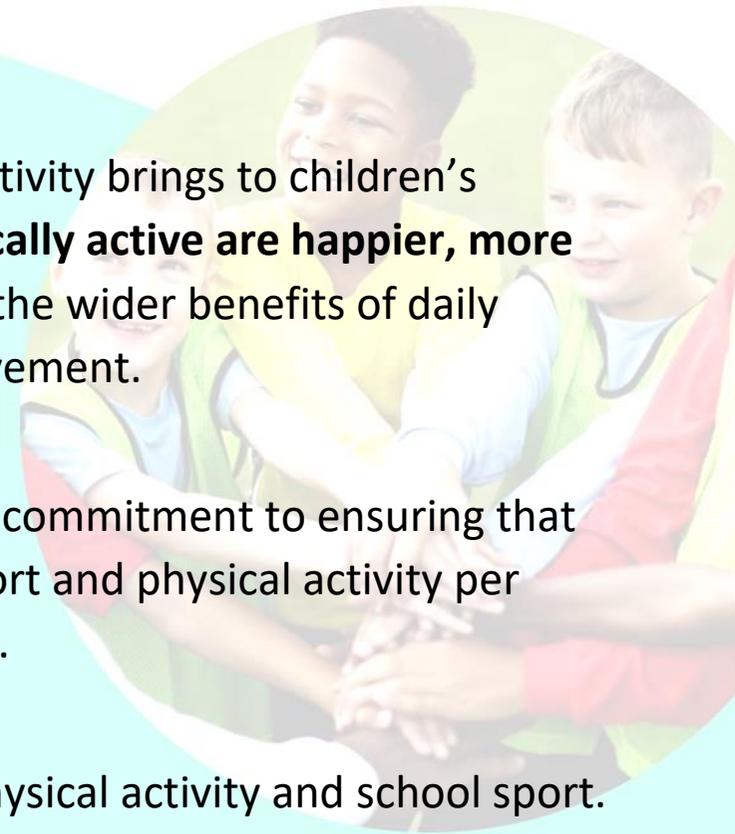
## PE and Sport premium grant – 2023/24 report

The Government recognises the numerous benefits that physical activity brings to children's physical, mental and emotional wellbeing. **Children who are physically active are happier, more resilient and more trusting of their peers.** They also acknowledge the wider benefits of daily activity such as improved behaviour and enhanced academic achievement.

The school sport and activity action plan sets out the government's commitment to ensuring that children and young people have access to at least 60 minutes of sport and physical activity per day, of which 30 minutes should be delivered during the school day.

Our school receives £20,000 to help us develop or add to our PE, physical activity and school sport. It is important that the enhancements we make are sustainable for our current pupils and pupils joining in future years.

There are 5 key indicators to follow, and here's how we plan to achieve them...



# Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity:

## • What we have done

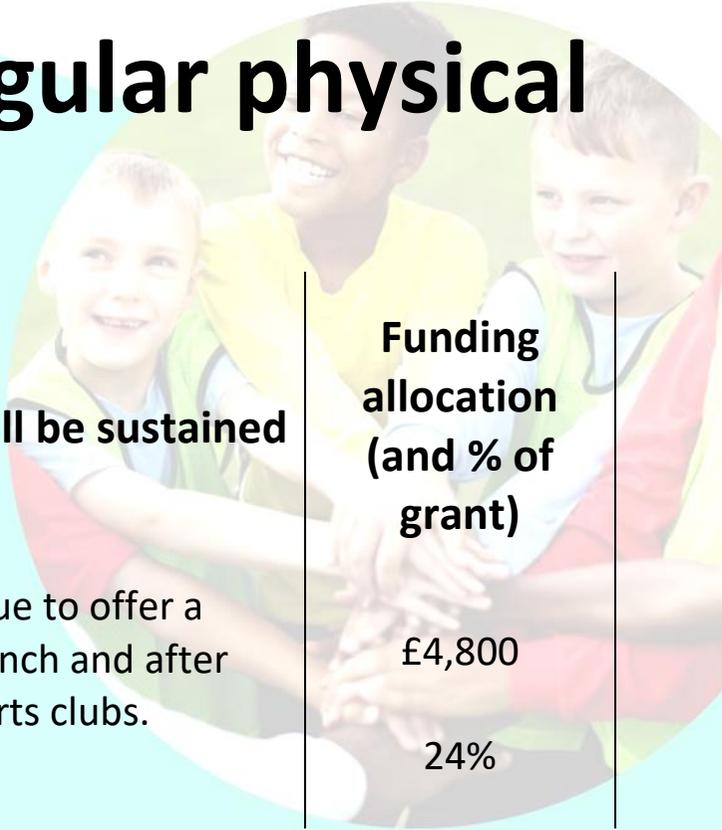
- Employed a sports coach to deliver lunch and after school clubs 4 days per week.

## • How this has affected our school

- Increased opportunities for our More Able pupils and engagement of target pupils such as KS2 girls.

## • How it will be sustained

- We continue to offer a range of lunch and after school sports clubs.

# The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school:

## • What we have done

- Set up a lunchtime Play Leaders programme with KS2 pupils leading on KS1 play.

## • How this has affected our school

- Engaged our KS2 pupils into sport and leadership as well as increased play opportunities for KS1.

## • How it will be sustained

- We will top-up the Play Leaders training each year.
- We also plan to open Play Leadership opportunities to KS1 pupils.
